

Social Media: How Are Our Children Communicating?

Some interesting results!

Recently, I did an informal survey of our grade four to six students to find out what the preferred choices of 9 to 12 year olds are to communicate with friends and family. Currently, the two most popular methods of communicating for this age group at BME appear to be text messaging and/or using Skype and Face time. It is also noteworthy that many more of our students now have their own cell phones, email accounts and Facebook accounts. Students report that they are knowledgeable of how to post on You Tube and Facebook.

With access, comes responsibility. THINK before you CLICK send is in a word, "wise". Regularly monitoring your child's text messages, posts and internet accounts is advised. As adults we all share the responsibility of educating our youth to use social media tools in a respectful and safe manner. One of Constable Mackinnon's main tips for parents is to collect the devices (Iphones, Ipods and notebooks etc.) before your child goes to bed. In her line of work she often finds that inappropriate messaging happens later in the evening behind closed doors. sleepovers are another prime time for children to experiment with social media.

At BME, we have included the District Social Media Policy in the front of our student agenda under the School Code of Conduct. This Board approved Social Media Policy is also available on line via SD 23 website. www.sd23.bc.ca

Each student and parent in our District is required to sign an Internet Use Agreement which outlines the guidelines for using school networks for educational purposes in a safe and respectful manner. Consequences for misuse follow our School Code of Conduct and may include loss of privileges to suspension and police involvement depending upon severity.

SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 23 (CENTRAL OKANAGAN) 2013/2014 INITIAL SCHOOL REGISTRATION FOR STUDENTS (INCLUDING FULL DAY KINDERGARTEN AND REGISTRATION FOR SCHOOLS OF CHOICE FOR K - 12)

WHEN TO REGISTER: Registration opens Monday, February 4, 2013 and closes Thursday, March 7, 2013

QUALIFYING AGE: To qualify for school enrollment in September 2013, a child must be five years of age by December 31, 2013.

REQUIRED DOCUMENTATION: A valid birth certificate and immunization records for the child and two pieces of parent identification, must be provided at the time of registration.

DEFERRED ENROLLMENT: The School Act allows a parent to defer the enrollment of a Kindergarten child for not more than one year.

Parents are encouraged to discuss deferment with the school principal before a decision is made.
